Introductions occurred as this was the first time the OSH Committee had meet.

Discussed OCDSB's failure to follow-up regarding much of the promised information, data collection or proactive policy changes following the town hall meeting.

Agreed that the committee would work towards establishing

- An OHS system that provided for timely and full disclosure to students, parents, volunteers and visitors of OHS exposure and risks. Presently there is no policy / legislation requiring any form of notice. The timeliness and quality of the disclosure to be akin to what is provided to workers presently; and
- 2. That until that policy change is implemented voluntary and timely full disclosure by OCDSB

Members of the Committee agreed to the following steps should be taken:

- 1. Request to meet with the Superintendent & Head of Facilities to obtain answers to the Student council requests for information already made in writing. (Scott to confirm that Student Council Co-Chairs making this request)
- 2. Request a meeting with School Trustee Chris Ellis regarding change to board policy to provide student council with copies of all OHS notices. (Scott to write Trustee)
- 3. Request the support of the MPP (Scott to write John Fraser's office)
- 4. Request the support of other Key MPPs to raise the issue in the legislature (Scott to request a meeting with Joel Harden NDP education critic Marit Stiles)
- 5. Call to Union President to look for support (Scott)
- 6. Request to view the OHS logs (Asbestos, lead flush) (Alex to request access)
- 7. Look into how to conduct and cost of lead testing (Jeff to look into this)
- 8. Access to information (Scott to write the OCDSB Solicitor for information on the ATIP Process)
- Request Engineers conditions assessment request. (Request to be made at meeting with Superintendent and Head of Facilities)
