1. Welcome and Introductions (Melissa Extross, Chair)

2. Approval of Agenda and Meeting Minutes (Melissa Extross, Chair)

The agenda was approved. The minutes from the last meeting were approved.

3. Chair's Report (Melissa Extross, Chair)

June 3 is a PA Day. Staff may be given the option to work from home. Plans for the Staff Appreciation Lunch will move ahead under the leadership of Shelly Firth.

5. Teacher's Report (Christol Barrett-Kilongozi, Teacher's Representative)

Gr. 3-6 students participated in three Luv 2 Groove workshops. Feedback was positive. Gr. 4-8 students are practising track and field events during Phys. Ed. classes.

Kindergarten students are learning about lifecycles and spring as well as watching grass seed grow in the Kinder yard. Some classes have been exploring land acknowledgments.

Gr. 4 students hosted a Literature Circles Fair.

Intermediate students built garden beds, in which Gr. 3 students will plant seeds, and participated in a University of Ottawa Maker Mobile workshop.

Class participation in Black History Month Missions increased. Marvellous Math Moments were popular in March and April, and Asian and Pacific Islander Month Missions in May are also enjoying increased participation.
