# Alta Vista Public School (AVPS) Minutes - School Council Wednesday, April 19, 2023 7-9 pm

## 4. Chair's Report (Melissa Extross)

#### Ski Club:

One person potentially reached out about interest in the Ski Club. This isn't a school or council funded event. This is a community parent who will connect with Ski Hawks who will run the event. The club will pick up and drop off participants from the school parking lot but the school and the council are not associated with the running of the club itself.

#### School Flower Beds:

Melissa met with a retired couple last week, Don and Maggie, who volunteer their time and take care of the garden beds at the side of the school. They won the number one garden in all of Ottawa via the Ottawa Horticultural Society a few years ago. They talked about their plans for the year and what they want to do for the gardening season. They spoke to Dennis about how to support them and he will speak to the OCDSB groundskeeper about putting mulch and top up soil in the beds (which are from their own garden or donated from other community gardeners). They will see if the board has access to soil and mulch that they are looking for. If not, we may see a request for mulch and soil. When they found out about the Spring Fair, they wanted to volunteer and help out Julie with the Plant Sale and are giving Julie any excess seedlings. They are reaching out to other community gardeners who have excess seedlings to donate to the Plant Sale at the Spring Fair.

## 5. Administrative Report (Dennis Paré, Principal)

## Construction Updates

The construction work continues. A lot of the exterior work is done. All the units are in place and they are waiting for some parts that are holding up the project but they expect to regain possession of the upstairs of the school in September 2023. This is important because they will be moving students upstairs. Starting in September, they will be closing another wing of the school, the Grade 1 and Music Room section, as well as classes along the north side of the first floor, the Science lab and three other classrooms. They will need to be closed for the entirety of the school year, so there will still be 12 portables outside.

## Staffing Updates

Karin and Dennis received the projected staffing for next year in September. They are now speaking with staff who may have a change in their teaching assignment for next year and decide whether they will have surplus or vacancies. This year, the school is fortunate enough to have another year without having to surplus any teachers. They will likely have to surplus an ECE (Early Childhood Educator), because they are dropping one kindergarten class next year. They are gaining an English class which is good news, they like to see English classes have more staff so they can avoid having larger classes that are more challenging to manage, especially with combined classes. There will still be combined grade classes in the English program but they're hoping they will be on the smaller side so they can accommodate their students with more precision with what they need.

Huge Congratulations to Karin who made it on the Principals list. She went through the selection process this year as a Vice Principal and was very successful in that process and was selected to be a Principal next year. So they are expecting Karin to take on her own school next year which is good news for Karin but sad news for the AVPS school community.

They will be starting IPRC (Identification, Placement and Review Committee) meetings in May, which is a busy time for the team. They are also looking to apply for specialized classes for some of the students. They are looking to make sure that everybody is entitled to help from a psychologist or social worker before the end of the year. With the pandemic being a challenge for a lot of our families, they're looking to make sure that those resources get placed and well used for the families that need it.

#### Flower Beds:

Dennis has a meeting tomorrow with the groundskeeper. Before the school council goes to purchase soil, he wants to make sure that if the school board has the budget for it he explores that first. He doesn't like seeing fundraised funds going towards something that is already budgeted.

## 6. Teacher's Report (Teacher's Representative)

## • Kindergarten:

Kinder students have been exploring the changes in seasons, as we have recently moved from winter to spring and have been discussing what that looks, sounds, and smells like. We have also been discussing living versus nonliving things, as we notice that plants and flowers are starting to grow, and animals are coming out of their winter homes. Students are curious about life cycles and will soon have the opportunity to plant seeds and watch them grow. We are also excited for our caterpillars to arrive the first week of May, so that we can discuss their progression to butterflies and release them out into nature.

Another theme that several classes are looking at is story sequencing (first, second, third, last) and structures (beginning, middle, end, plot, climax, problem, solution, conclusion). Some classes have been using puppet theaters to re-enact and retell familiar stories and fairytales and have been very creative while doing so! This also lends itself well to learning to contribute to a group and practice social skills with peers.

#### Primary:

Primary students (and Juniors) enjoyed a peek into Voyageur life with a guest speaker named Louis Mercier. He delighted us with his tales of times gone by and his catchy songs. Thank you, School Council!

The grade 2s have been exploring the world in many ways. They have sent their version of Flat Stanley around the world, compared traditions and celebrations with a multi-faith field trip to a Hindu Temple, a Synagogue, a Greek Orthodox Church and a Mosque and have been learning about homes and families on each continent.

#### • Junior:

Grades 4-6 also enjoyed learning about French folklore traditions from Louis Mercier.

Grade 4s had their Scientists in the Schools workshop on pulleys and gears. Thank you to the school council for funding this fun experience!

Junior Robotics Club is up and running at AV! Lots of grade 4, 5 and 6 students have been engaged in learning how to use and program Lego Mindstorms EV3 robots every Monday!

Students in EF5A and EF56A have been using Lego Mindstorms EV3 robots for a robotic race track/maze project in class.

#### Intermediate:

The Intermediate Robotics Club is up and running at AV! Lots of grade 7 and 8 students have been engaged in learning how to use and program Lego Mindstorms EV3 robots every Wednesday!

EF8A and EF8B have been doing Buddies with R12 and R345. We do Math buddies as well as outdoor buddies.

## Physical Education:

Thanks to the school council's annual budget, we've purchased a new round of playground balls for all Gr.1-8 classes to use at recess.

The Rhythmic Gymnastics team will be performing for the school on May 15th and taking a field trip to Charles Hulse on May 19th to perform for their grade 4, 5, 6 students.
